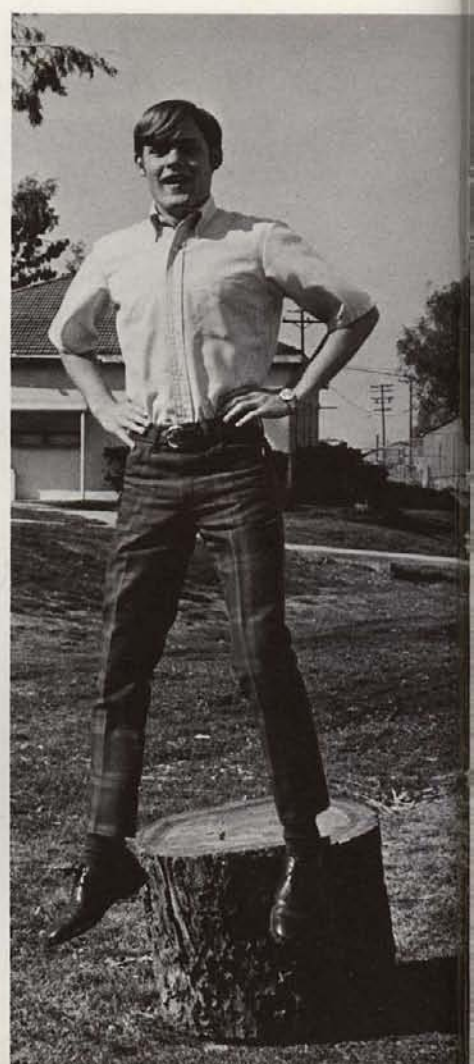


Talent unlimited was shown by the Seniors as they progressed through "A Road to the 70's." Creative imagination made the benefit successful.

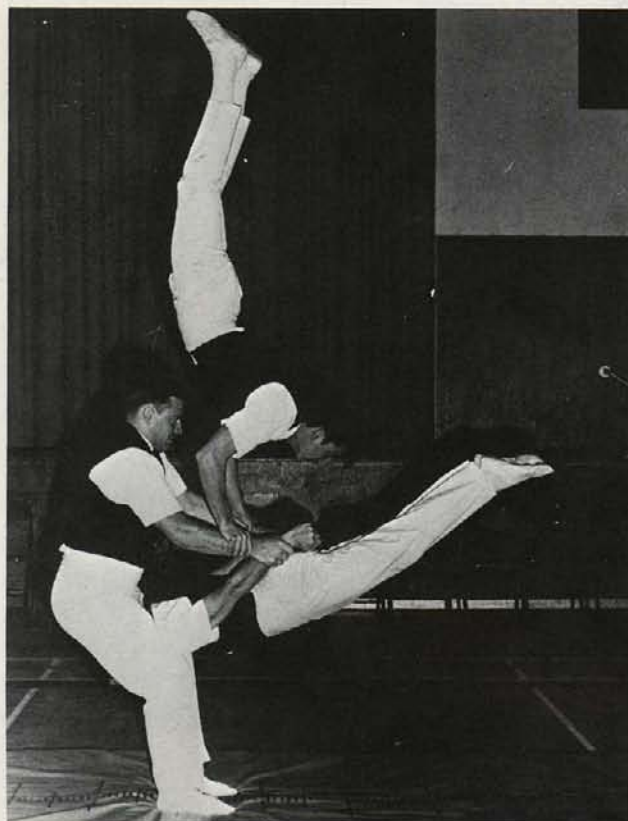






Scores of performances kept Madrigals and Choir more than busy. But the enjoyment gained made up for every weary moment.
